

NICENE CREED

**We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty,

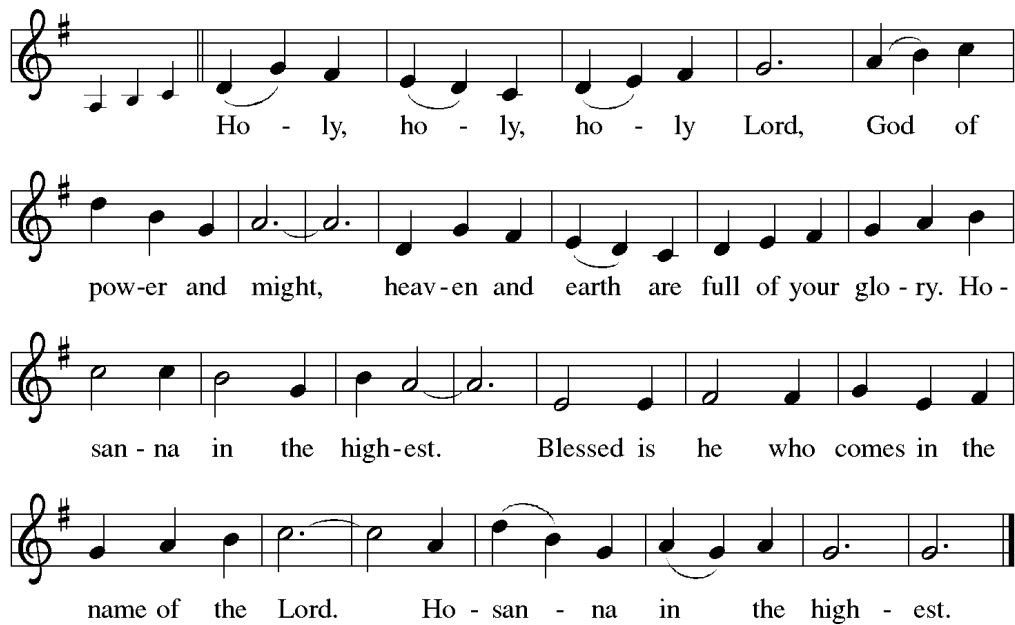

Do this for the remembrance of me.


