## NICENE CREED

**We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty,  
maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.**

from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the

**P** We give you thanks, Father, through Jesus Christ, your beloved Son,

Here at this Table, you are wanted and welcomed. You are safe and loved.

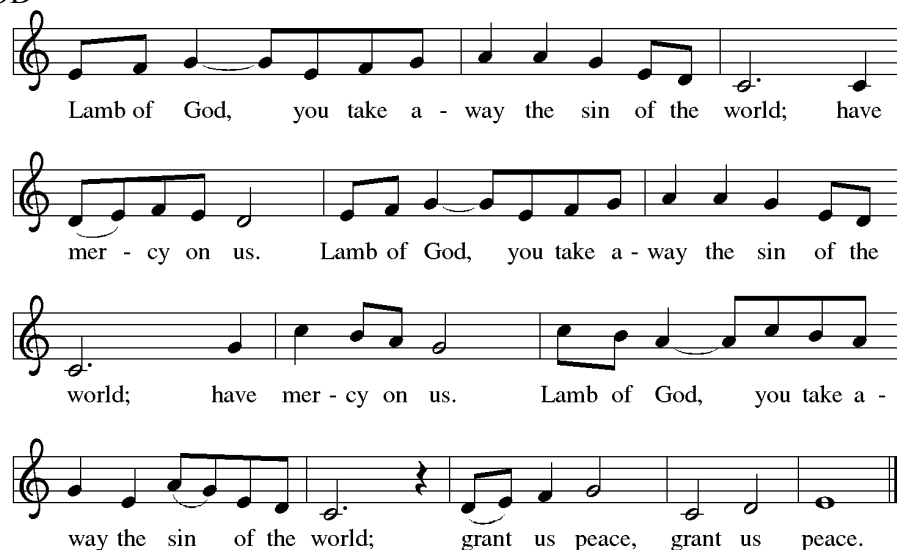
Here at this Table, you belong.
